## Family Law Act, section 203

Thank you for your letter of April 14, 2022, regarding s. 203 of the Family Law Act (FLA). The briefing note accompanying your letter describes concerns with s. 203 and proposes amendments that would remove the legislative threshold for appointing a lawyer to represent a child in an FLA proceeding and add a provision specifying that a child for whom a lawyer has been appointed has the rights of a party.

I appreciate the time and careful thought that CBABC members put into the briefing note. Government recognizes the benefits that a children's lawyer can bring to some cases under the FLA. Accordingly, the new Provincial Court Family Rules clarify the role and obligations of a children's lawyer and the information they are entitled to receive while representing a child. Also, the Province now provides approximately a million dollars annually to the Society for Children and Youth to expand the Society's capacity to meet the growing demand for legal services for children and youth and provide access to more lawyers across the province. With respect to the legislative concerns the CBABC has raised, the Family Policy Legislation and Transformation Division is undertaking a multiphase project to review and modernize the FLA. The review will consider the legislative provisions addressing the appointment of a lawyer for a child in a proceeding under the FLA, including both the underlying policy and the specific language used in s. 203.
